

Page Nomination Information

The Constituent Page Program consists of high school students who are hired to serve the U.S. House of Representatives. Currently there are 72 Page positions available in the House of Representatives.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Page Program, every applicant must satisfy certain requirements. Pages must be at least 16 years old before the day their Page term begins. A Page for the Summer Term must have completed the 10th grade but not started the 12th grade. . They must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. They must show proof of citizenship. Every applicant must have the sponsorship of Congressman Honda. Due to the nature of the job, every applicant must be in good health, have plenty of stamina, and problem free feet.

How to Apply

The application and all required materials are due on Friday, March 26 before 5:00pm to my District Office at 1999 S Bascom Ave, Suite 815, Campbell CA 95008. The application consists of the application form, a high school transcript containing grades from ninth grade to the current semester, a parental consent form, a resume of extracurricular activities, 3 letters of recommendation, a 50-100 word essay describing why the applicant would like to become a page, and a letter of support from Congressman Honda. Page Program Duties

The duties of a page are very important. The duties of a page primarily consist of delivery of correspondence, legislative material and small packages within the Congressional complex. The semester Pages report to work after classes and continue until 4:30 PM or until the House

adjourns for the day.

Students selected as Pages are asked to serve at least one full semester and may be asked to serve two semesters. The academic semesters are fall and spring and require attendance to the House of Representatives Page School. Students attending the fall and spring semesters are required to reside in the House Residence Hall. The summer program starts on Sunday, June 6, 2010 and ends on Friday, July 2, 2010.

The House Page School begins at 6:45am with classes in Mathematics, English, Social Studies, Science, Foreign Language and Computer Technology. To allow each student to gain exposure to government, there are mandatory Washington Seminars for all Pages.

The dress requirement for males is navy blazer, long sleeved white shirt, dark gray slacks, black socks, dark shoes, and a standard-issue tie (navy with red and white stripes). For females, a navy blazer, long sleeved white blouse, dark gray skirt or pants, black shoes, appropriate hosiery and a standard-issue tie (navy with red and white stripes) that is provided during orientation

Compensation and Fees

All Pages are compensated with a monthly salary of approximately \$1,500. Automatic deductions will be made for federal and states taxes, Social Security, and the Residence Hall fees. Pages are paid on the last working day of the month. There is an initial \$100 security deposit for the residency halls. An additional \$400 monthly fee is required for the residence hall, which includes five breakfasts, six lunches, and five dinners per week and is automatically deducted from the Page's salary.
